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R.I. Pre-kindergarten Program set to open more classrooms, increase access for families

Rhode Island is adding 12 sites this fall to the Rhode Island Pre-kindergarten Program, bringing the total number of sites to 29 and making the 2016-17 pre-kindergarten program the largest ever.

Pending approval of Governor Raimondo’s budget and thanks to the federal Preschool Expansion Grant that Rhode Island received from the U.S. Department of Education, pre-kindergarten programs will be located this fall in 11 communities: Central Falls, Cranston, East Providence, Johnston, Newport, North Providence, Pawtucket, Providence, Warwick, West Warwick, and Woonsocket.

“We are continuing to create opportunities for all Rhode Islanders, including maintaining our commitment to high-quality early learning programs for our youngest learners,” said Governor Gina M. Raimondo. “It’s great news for Rhode Island children and parents that we plan to provide even more free pre-kindergarten choices for families in the coming school year. Our on-going support for early learning will help us meet our goal: All Rhode Island children reading on grade level by the end of 3rd grade.”

“Our continued investment and commitment to the Rhode Island Pre-kindergarten Program will enable families in 11 communities across the state to access Pre-K education,” said Barbara S. Cottam, Chair of the Board of Education. “Providing these free, high-quality early learning programs is a major step toward closing the equity gap and ensuring that all of our children enter kindergarten ready to learn.”

“As we continue expanding pre-kindergarten options in Rhode Island, it’s equally important that we focus on program quality,” said Daniel P. McConaghy, Chair of the Council on Elementary and Secondary Education. “Governor Raimondo’s budget includes funds to support program quality while expanding options for families. These investments will pay huge dividends as more

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and more Rhode Island children will develop, at an early age, the skills they will need for school success.”

“We know that it’s never too early to start a child’s education, and our continued investments in the Rhode Island Pre-kindergarten Program will give hundreds of Rhode Island families a jump start on learning for their children,” said Education Commissioner Ken Wagner. “Early-childhood education is one of the priorities in our Strategic Plan, so we are pleased that this fall there will be a total of 29 sites offering free pre-kindergarten programs. We hope that many Rhode Island parents and guardians will take advantage of this opportunity and apply for a spot for their children in one of our high-quality programs.”

With a total of 56 classrooms scheduled to be opened this fall, Rhode Island is approaching the state goal of 60 pre-kindergarten classrooms by 2019. The expansion of the pre-kindergarten program, however, depends on approval by the General Assembly of Governor Raimondo’s budget, which includes \$5.2 million for early-learning programs.

The Rhode Island Pre-kindergarten Program, entering its 8th year, provides free, high-quality pre-kindergarten classes to eligible children. The R.I. Department of Education (RIDE) oversees the program. Statewide, spaces will be available for 1,008 children to participate in the 56 pre-kindergarten classrooms. To be eligible, children must be 4 years old by September 1 and they must be residents of one of the identified communities. Children are selected for participation by lottery.

RIDE will release the 2016-17 Pre-Kindergarten Program child lottery application and open the online Pre-Kindergarten Program child lottery application system **today** (Wednesday, May 11). Families will be able to apply online at <https://www3.ride.ri.gov/PKLottery> or family members

may pick up an application at either the pre-kindergarten program location or at the district location when so noted above. Families can also download the application, at www.ride.ri.gov/EC-Programs-PreK. Completed applications should be returned to the program of choice. Families may apply at more than one site if multiple sites exist in their community of residence, but only one application per site will be accepted. Applications will be accepted through **July 1**.

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
